

Scarecrow Contest Entry Information Sheet

Scarecrow Contest

- The scarecrow contest will take place in downtown Emmett during the Harvest Festival. Scarecrows will be on assigned light poles on Main St.
- The scarecrows will be on display from Thursday, September 23 to November 1, 2021. You can make arrangements with the Chamber to take them down earlier.
- Judging will take place on Saturday, September 25, 2021, at 9:00am winners will be announced on the Harvest Festival stage at 10:00am.
- Event Coordinators reserves the right to remove entries. Participants are encouraged to create positive, creative and nonviolent family friendly scarecrows
- Scarecrow participants are required to monitor the health and well-being of their scarecrow for the duration of the event. Participants will be asked to remove their scarecrows if it deteriorates beyond reason.
- Scarecrows must be removed No later than 5:00 pm on November 1, 2020.

Scarecrow Contest Registration

- Those who wish to participate in the scarecrow contest must submit an entry form. Forms may be picked up at the Gem County Chamber of Commerce.
- Each participant will be assigned a designated light pole by the Event Coordinators.
- Once event coordinators have received your entry form you will be assigned a pole. Scarecrows can be set up September 19, 2021, through September 23, 2021. Make sure you secure your scarecrow for stormy weather.

Scarecrow Construction

- All scarecrow entries will remain on display outside September 24th through November 1, 2021, and may be subjected to sun, severe wind, snow, and/or rain. Their construction should be durable and all ornamentation securely attached. No perishable goods may be used in the construction or display. The event coordinators reserve the right to remove any scarecrow that does not hold up to the natural elements.
- Each scarecrow must have horizontal support. This support is needed as each scarecrow will be tied to a light post for display.
- Your exhibit may include more than one figure but no more than three.
